	Terms: 3 and 4 Date: January 2017
	Topic titles: The Rainforest, Weather and Climate
English	Children will develop their reading and writing skills through a range of text types including: mythical stories & mysteries, informative texts, texts which raise important issues, instructions and poetry.
	Children will be learning about prefix and suffix rules, homophones, and the origins of words to support their spellings. We will continue to extend sentence writing with the use of adjectives, adverbs, conjunctions, synonyms and varied opening words.
Mathematics	Addition, subtraction, multiplication & division methods and problems, measurement (including time), statistics, fractions. Ongoing revision of all areas covered.
Science	Living things and habitats, food chains
	The Water Cycle, Environmental change
Computing	Review of e-safety including the sharing of information, producing power points, Coding and animation.
Geography	Using maps to locate countries and to describe physical geography, using a range of resources to research rainforests, studying weather and climate.
Art & Design and	Improve painting and drawing techniques, Henri Rousseau
Design & Technology	Design and make weather instruments
Music	Learning to play the ukulele and singing.
Languages: French	Carnival of the animals and 'Tell me a story'
Physical education	Hockey and .
Religious education	Sikhism.
PSEE	Dealing with conflicts and supporting others.
Homework	 Weekly homework: usually maths or English (linked to class work)
	Daily reading & keeping a reading journal
	 Occasional follow up tasks from reading groups Times tables & division facts (regular practice)
	 Spellings (applying rules and strategies and year group spellings)
Events	Easter production & World Book Day
Other information	PE will be usually on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons (no jewellery please).
	Reading books and journals need to be in school every day.
	Homework will be given out on a Friday and is due back by the following Wednesday.
