**Topic titles:**

**“Infinity and Beyond”**

**“Mountains High”**

<b>English</b>	Story planning, structure and characterisation. Stories from other cultures. Recounts, diaries, biographies and autobiographies. Letters, non-linear texts and revision of all six major non-fiction text types. Spelling rules.
<b>Mathematics</b>	Continuation of work with all four operations. Brackets, algebra, time and timetables. Roman numerals, ratio and proportion. Data analysis, negative numbers, inverse operations. Emphasis on independence and problem solving.
<b>Science</b>	Earth and space: days, seasons, planets. Space travel.
<b>Computing</b>	Using spreadsheets as a tool to help organise data. Recording, changing and manipulating audio input.
<b>Geography</b>	Mountain environments: human and physical geography.
<b>Design and technology</b>	Gears and pulleys.
<b>Music</b>	Exploring musical sources. Processed music.
<b>Art and design</b>	Styles of famous artists. Working and combining media to achieve different effects. 3D modelling. Textiles.
<b>Physical education</b>	Gymnastics and invasion games
<b>Religious education</b>	Hinduism
<b>Personal, social and emotional education</b>	Getting on and falling out Circle Time: Airing and dealing with current concerns
<b>Homework</b>	Daily reading; school books, weekly news report (to include locating the story on a map of the UK) Daily times tables practice (weekly tests in terms 1, 3 and 5) Spellings to work on with weekly tests in terms 2, 4 and 6. “World expert” presentation on a pioneer. Own choice of style and content. Occasional other task to support another curriculum area of current work.
